

BREBEUF JESUIT MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission of Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School, which is Jesuit, Catholic, and Interfaith, is to provide an excellent college preparatory education by preparing its students for a lifetime of leadership in service to others as men and women who are intellectually competent, open to growth, loving, religious, and committed to promoting justice. In pursuit of the Mission, Brebeuf Jesuit affirms two essential principles: the education of the whole person and the care of the person.

TITLE OF POSITION: Biology I Teacher

ACCOUNTABILITY: This position reports to the Principal and to the Science Department Chairperson.

RESPONSIBILITIES: (Note: The following list of responsibilities is not exhaustive. Others may be assigned, subject to reasonable accommodations.)

- Implement and help to develop departmental curricula for subject area. Collaborate with
 other science teachers to ensure scope and sequence is aligned with concurrent and secondyear courses.
- Participate in individual, departmental and school-wide professional development (examples: curriculum and assessment, diversity training, Ignatian education workshops, technology training, HASTI, NSTA, NABT).
- Regularly participate in the extracurricular life of the students and the school.
- Teach and lead students in accordance with Ignatian educational principles and the mission of Brebeuf Jesuit.
- Act as a personal example of those attributes to which we call our students (the "Grad at Grad"): open to growth, intellectually competent, loving, religious, and committed to promoting justice.
- Design, plan, and implement regular laboratory activities where students analyze, evaluate and create knowledge and is appropriate for the current topic of study.
- Order and inventory lab equipment and supplies.
- Maintain and repair lab equipment.
- Model and enforce appropriate safety measures in lab.
- Prepare and follow an annual budget.
- Utilize various instructional strategies (best practices and innovative techniques) to meet the needs of all learners-including students with learning differences.
- Collaborate with Academic Counselors, the Student Advocate, and Learning Center Faculty to foster the intellectual, spiritual, physical, emotional and social development of every student.
- Demonstrate comfort with, and openness to, a technology-rich teaching and learning
 environment, including, but not limited to: a 1:1 Bring Your Own Technology environment
 (student choice in personal devices to access the web, create, communicate, and collaborate),
 e-textbooks, web-based grade book, attendance and communication and collaboration
 systems.
- Assist students in the transition from various middle schools to Brebeuf through collaboration with freshmen teachers across disciplines and by completing activities to model expectations at Brebeuf and foster the development of the whole person.
- Model appropriate study skills and techniques to foster life-long learning in students from various backgrounds.
- Actively and regularly engage parents in communication about students.
